Park County Director of Environmental Health Receives State Award

Park County Director of Environmental Health, Craig Caes received a certificate of recognition from the Montana Environmental Health Association (MEHA) at their annual conference this month. The MEHA certificate of recognition is awarded to individuals or organizations deserving of recognition for a special achievement in environmental health or special effort that promotes or supports the work of environmental health.

This year Craig was recognized for his commitment to upholding state environmental and public health protections and for the positive leadership he brings to his job, his staff and to the relationships he builds with the community.
